

Dress Code

Philosophy Statement

Appearance affects attitude and attitude affects behavior. An appearance of modesty and neat, clean grooming portrays a positive, ready to learn attitude. Holy Trinity's dress code is designed so that students can honor the Lord in an academic environment that is conducive to learning without distraction.

Students in grades kindergarten through grade eight are required to dress in conformity with the following rules:

Shirts:

Either short **or** long-sleeved button polo shirt in any solid color (without stripes or trim colors), to be worn tucked in. A **white** undershirt with matching sleeve length may be worn under a polo shirt.

Pants:

Belted twill pants in navy or khaki (pleated or flat front style- **no cargo**), worn with a basic solid-colored belt (belts are optional for K-2). No tight or form fitting pants (less than 5% stretchable material).

Dress shorts:

Belted twill shorts in navy or khaki (pleated or flat front style- no cargo).

Sweater:

Solid color in navy, black, gray, or white (no sweatshirt or hoodie style).

Socks:

Solid crew sock, color in white, black, gray, or navy.



Shoes:

Athletic shoes (no boots, sandals, flip flops).

An extra pair of tennis shoes kept at school is required for gym usage.

Spirit Wear Fridays:

Any shirt or sweatshirt with Holy Trinity Lutheran or Evergreen Lutheran name or logo is permissible.

(Optional)

Knee-length skirt, skort, jumper, or capri pants in khaki or navy.

It is expected that all clothing items will fit, be clean, and in good repair.

Dress Code Violation Consequences:

- 1. Student will be expected to immediately correct dress code items.
- 2. Student will need to call home for proper dress code items.
- 3. Repeat offenders will keep at least one extra set of uniform items at school.
- 4. Repeat offenders may be subject to after-school detention.
